FOCUS ON PASSAGE

- ✓ Say: Let's see what the Bible teaches us this week. Read this week's passage.
- ✓ Ask for someone to retell the passage in their own words. Like they were telling a friend who wasn't there.
- ✓ Do you agree with their retelling? Is there something they added or left out that they shouldn't have? As long as the group doesn't miss a key component of the passage, continue. If they miss something, read the passage again. If someone states something that isn't in the passage, ask, "Where did you find [what they said] in this passage?" Reread the passage, if necessary.

If we believe this passage is from God, how must we change?



Who are you going to share this passage with before we meet again?

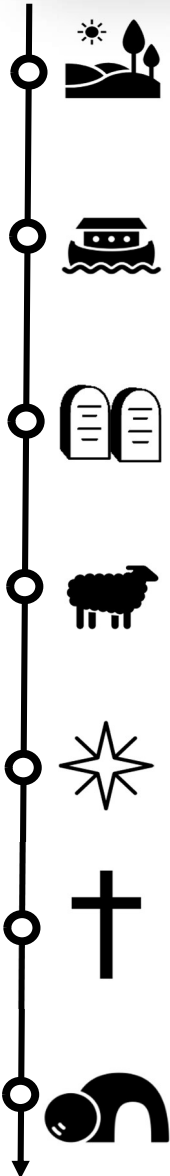
- ① What are you thankful for this week?

DISCOVERY BIBLE STUDY QUESTIONS



REASONS FOR THESE QUESTIONS

Each of the Discovery Questions is critical for embedding the DNA of church within the lives of men and women as they are being disciplined into a relationship with Jesus.

Removing any of the questions entirely will severely impact the group's ability to multiply into another group.

If you remove:

Accountability questions: People in the group will eventually stop following through with their commitments to serve each other, serve their neighbors, obey the passage, and share the passage with others.

Service questions: Nobody sees or experiences the care and concern the group has for one another and for the community.

Obedience question: Nobody experiences the blessings God bestows on those who demonstrate their love for Him by obeying His commands. They also do not experience the transformation created by daily personal obedience.

Sharing question: The group is less likely to multiply because its members aren't sharing what they are hearing with outsiders.
